3. Radon

The district has developed a radon plan as required by ORS 332.167. Community members can access a copy of the radon plan here: www.daytonk12.org. Test results will be made public and posted to the district website when available.

4. Lead in Drinking water

Initial Testing: In order to comply with OAR 581-022-2223(5)(d), the District has developed a plan to test all water taps used for drinking or food preparation in the School District. Samples have been/will be sent to WATERLAB corp., an OHA accredited drinking water laboratory. Access to water taps that have more than 20 parts per billion of lead will be shut off and/or covered, and students and staff will have access to bottled water or clear taps. Results will be made available to students, families and the community as quickly as possible. The District will work to mitigate and correct the sources of lead following EPA guidance.

Future Testing Plan: In compliance with Rule 22, Dayton School District will complete bi-annual testing of all water pipes for lead levels. Testing will be done during the summer months prior to school resuming for the upcoming bi-annual year. Dayton has 51 water sources including drinking fountains, faucets, and food prep areas at all of our three school sites. Bi-annually all 51 sources will be tested through an accredited, OHA approved drinking water laboratory. Any source that has over the current recommended lead parts per billion will be shut off and/or covered until corrections are made and it can be retested. Testing results and data will be

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made available to students, families and the community after testing is complete and results are received.

5. Lead Paint

In order to comply with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule, the district will only contract with certified lead based paint renovation contractors licensed by the Oregon Construction Contractors Board, and or use district staff that are certified by the Oregon Health Authority to perform the work.

6. Integrated Pest Management

7. Communication

The district will make all test results and detailed information explaining the test results available to the public within five business days of receiving the results. Results will be made available by posting the results on the district website, by requesting the results via email to the District Secretary, and by making the results available in hardcopy at the main administration office.
